Hersh v. Bill's House Movers – Catastrophic Injury – Defense Verdict

After their car ran into the house, two young ladies sued a house-mover moving a house on Roswell Road at 2:00 a.m. Despite serious injuries to both sympathetic plaintiffs, after a two-week trial in Fulton County, the jury returned a defense verdict.

Culbertson v. Caterpillar, Inc. – Environmental Nuisance – Corporate Target Defendant Wins!

Thirty landowners sued a foundry in Stephens County claiming damages from the smell and noise. After a three-week trial in a remote yet “local” venue, the jury deliberated less than a day and returned thirty defense verdicts.

Godbee v. Kia Motors of America, Inc., et al. – Automotive Manufacturer Wins Wrongful Death Lawsuit

Along with national counsel for Kia, Kia was successfully defended in a wrongful death lawsuit in Cobb County involving Kia Sephia.

Lawler v. Georgia Pipe, et al. – Major Setoff Enforced on Appeal

After a hard-fought wrongful death case in Fulton County with a Plaintiff's verdict less than the last offer from Defendant, Brad was successful in enforcing the law of setoffs in Georgia and treatment of prior payments from settling defendants under joint-and-several law in a fashion to avoid an “end run” of the credits.

Dodd v. Shoei Co., Ltd. – Products Liability – Defense Verdict

After a four-day trial in a plaintiff friendly venue involving the death of a teenage girl against a helmet manufacturer, a Fulton County jury returned a verdict in favor of Defendant Shoei with no appeal by Plaintiffs.
